Toledo GROWs, Gardens Revitalize Our World, educates our community about the value of local nutritious food. Our active urban farm and support for community gardens promote healthy eating and create a region alive with gardens.

Since its creation in 1995, the organization has grown to include 125 community gardens and an urban farm in downtown Toledo – the home of Toledo GROWs. The farm offers a variety of educational features, including the Robert J. Anderson Urban Agriculture Center, hoop houses, a greenhouse, chickens, bees, a teaching kitchen, and a variety of garden beds to demonstrate and teach sustainable practices in growing produce. It serves as home base for Toledo GROWs' work with community gardens, including technical assistance, free seeds and seedlings, education, loan of tools, and assistance with volunteers. People of all ages come to the farm to learn through educational programs and field trips, as well as through hands-on learning as they volunteer.

Programs

Seed Swap – community-wide event with free seeds and gardening information for 1,000 participants, a workshop, hands-on demonstrations, children's activities, and 25+ community partner displays.

Support for Community Gardens – 125 community gardens receive free seeds and seedlings, education, loan of tools, materials, connection to services, and networking with other gardeners.

Urban Farm Educational Facility – two and one-half acre farm in central Toledo, with gardens of all sizes, chickens, honeybees, raingardens, hoop house, classroom, and a teaching kitchen.

Educating our community about the value of local nutritious food.

Why is this work important?

In Lucas County:

- 18% of residents live in poverty – 25.5% in Toledo
- 21 census tracts are food deserts - 18% of residents live in those areas
- 72% of adult residents are overweight or obese
- Only 20% of area adults eat five daily servings of fruits and vegetables – 4% eat none
- 22% of residents feel only slightly safe in their neighborhood – 4% feel not at all safe

We know:

- People who garden eat more fruits and vegetables
- Gardening motivates people to stay active longer than other activities
- Community gardeners save between \$75 and \$380 in food costs each season
- When neighbors know and interact with one another, they feel safer
- Crime decreases in neighborhoods as the amount of green space increases

How does Toledo GROWs assist people of all ages learn to grow and eat healthy food?

Community Garden Support

Provides the knowledge and tools needed to build and run a garden, including site visits, workshops, gardener gatherings, and seasonal advice

Education for Youth

Hands-on activities correlated to the state content standards, in the classroom or field trips to the farm

Education for Adults

Workshops, events, and other opportunities in a variety of venues

Urban Farm

Educational facility with gardens, bees, chickens, and a teaching kitchen

Volunteer Opportunities

Actively engage people in the community

Partnerships
