The movement that began as three community gardens 30 years ago has grown to include 108 community gardens and an urban farm in downtown Toledo – the home of Toledo GROWs. The farm offers a variety of educational features, including the Robert J. Anderson Urban Agriculture Center,



hoop houses, a greenhouse, bees, a teaching kitchen, and a variety of garden beds to demonstrate and teach sustainable practices in growing produce. It serves as home base for Toledo GROWs' work with community gardens and education.



People of all ages come to the farm to learn through educational programs and field trips, as well as through hands-on learning as they volunteer.

SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITY GARDENS
